Chapter 1. Ordering, accessing, and printing z/OS documentation

The following topics explain how you can obtain z/OS information in softcopy, hardcopy, and on the Internet.

Documents on CD-ROM collections

When you order z/OS, you automatically receive the:

- ***z/OS Version 1 Release 4 Collection***, SK3T-4269, containing unlicensed documents for z/OS in BookManager® and PDF formats. This collection includes documents for only one release of the z/OS element and feature libraries. It is refreshed at least once for each release.

The product libraries included in this collection contain the latest updates of the books available when the collection was produced. Some books and bookshelves have not been updated since the previous release of z/OS and are still valid for the current release of the product. Unchanged books and bookshelves list the version and release in which they were last updated.

The ***z/OS Collection*** does not include documents for the software products that run on z/OS. *z/OS Software Products Collection*, which you can purchase, contains documents for the software products that run on z/OS.

The unencrypted licensed documents for z/OS in BookManager and PDF formats are available for a fee on:

- ***z/OS Licensed Product Library***, LK3T-4307.

Note: You must have a license for z/OS to order this collection. See “Ordering hardcopy documents or softcopy collections” on page 3 for information on how to order this collection.

In addition to the above collections, you can purchase the following collections individually, or when you order z/OS you can purchase them by subscriptions. Accessing wizards on the Internet

Wizards provide a simplified approach to completing a set of complex z/OS tasks, such as planning or customization. The wizards provide customized information based on your individual requirements and answers. The wizard asks you for information, and then takes you to the next step.

The wizards simplify your planning and configuration needs by exploiting recommended values and by providing customized checklists that reduce the number of steps and the number of information sources that you need to refer to.

There is help available in the wizards if you need some background information. And, if you want to read more in-depth background material, there are often links to documents that provide additional related information.

Our wizards are Web-based, and do not directly perform any tasks on your z/OS system itself. Instead, they generate outputs like tailored instructions, or jobs, policies, or parmlib members that you can upload to z/OS and use.

The following wizards are available now:

- **z/OS and OS/390 Planning Assistant for e-business**

Intended for the technical manager responsible for e-business planning, this wizard asks a few questions about your objectives and current configuration and then recommends a customized set of products and features for e-business on z/OS and OS/390.

- **z/OS msys for Operations Customization Wizard**

Intended to help you configure msys for Operations, an element of z/OS that provides automation function to simplify daily operations, and detect and recover from deteriorating situations that could compromise availability. This tool will prompt you for your installation-unique information, and generate batch jobs that you upload to your system and run.

- **ShopzSeries**

Reduces the time spent completing the S/390[®] software ordering checklist for system/product refreshes and upgrades. Additionally, it provides valuable functions for system/product upgrade planning.

- **z/OS and z/OS.e Installation Planning Wizard**

Intended to help you build customized installation plans. It is an interactive version of *z/OS and z/OS.e Planning for Installation*.

- **z/OS DFSMS Migration Planning Wizard**

Intended for those planning to migrate from a previous release of DFSMS/MVS[®] (V1R3, V1R4, or V1R5) , OS/390 V2R10 DFSMS, or z/OS V1R1 DFSMS to the new DFSMS functions and features available in z/OS Version 1 Release 3. It is an interactive version of *z/OS DFSMS Migration*.

- **z/OS DFSMSrmm[™] Customization Wizard**

Designed to help you set up DFSMSrmm by selecting a standard setup that uses DFSMSrmm default values or a customized setup that you tailor for your

installation. This wizard builds the EDGRMMxx parmlib member and provides JCL jobs to setup RACF for DFSMSrmm and jobs to allocate and initialize the datasets needed by DFSMSrmm.

- **z/OS SDSF Customization Wizard**

Intended for those who want to exploit the sysplex support in z/OS SDSF, this wizard builds tailored JCL, ISFPARMS statements, and RACF commands. It also provides a fast, tailored reference to the SAF resources, and associated RACF commands that protect SDSF functions.

- **z/OS IP Configuration Wizard**

Intended for those who have little experience configuring z/OS Communications Server IP. It sets up a basic IP configuration for a single system, allowing you to configure a single stack with simple instances of OMPROUTE, FTP, and TN3270 servers, and with all device types, including static VIPA. Even if you have already configured z/OS IP, you can compare the output from this wizard with your existing configuration settings.

- **z/OS UNIX® Customization Wizard**

Intended to help you build two BPXPRMxx parmlib members, one with system processing parameters and one with file system statements. With the wizard, sysplex users can build a single BPXPRMxx parmlib member to define all the file systems used by systems participating in shared HFS. The wizard also builds a batch job that does the initial RACF security setup for z/OS UNIX. The wizard can be used by those who are installing z/OS UNIX System Services for the first time, and by current z/OS UNIX users, to verify settings.

- **z/OS Base Sysplex Customization Wizard**

Some products and z/OS elements require a base sysplex or Parallel Sysplex® to run. If you are not able to migrate to a Parallel Sysplex, this assistant will help you customize a single-system base sysplex so that you can take advantage of these products.

- **z/OS Parallel Sysplex Customization Wizard**

Intended for those who are setting up a Parallel Sysplex for the first time, this wizard builds tailored instructions, jobs, and parmlib members for configuring a Parallel Sysplex. However, anyone can use the tool to test and verify parameters. Another useful tool is the S/390 Coupling Facility Structure Sizer (CFSizer), designed to size your Parallel Sysplex structures.

Using LookAt to look up message explanations

LookAt is an online facility that lets you look up explanations for most messages you encounter, as well as for some system abends and codes. Using LookAt to find information is faster than a conventional search because in most cases LookAt goes directly to the message explanation.

You can access LookAt from the Internet at:

<http://www.ibm.com/eserver/zseries/zos/bkserv/lookat/> or from anywhere in z/OS or z/OS.e where you can access a TSO/E command line (for example, TSO/E prompt, ISPF, z/OS UNIX System Services running OMVS).

The LookAt Web site also features a mobile edition of LookAt for devices such as Pocket PCs, Palm OS, or Linux-based handhelds. So, if you have a handheld

device with wireless access and an Internet browser, you can now access LookAt message information from almost anywhere.

To use LookAt as a TSO/E command, you must have LookAt installed on your host system. You can obtain the LookAt code for TSO/E from a disk on your *z/OS Collection* (SK3T-4269) or from the LookAt Web site's **Download** link.

Cross-book linking among z/OS documents

z/OS documents include softcopy links that let you jump directly from one softcopy document to another. While reading a z/OS document, you can place the cursor under the highlighted title of a referenced z/OS document and press Enter to open that document. After searching and reading the related material, you can close the referenced document to return to the original document. For example, Chapter 2, "z/OS document descriptions", on page 13 contains links to the softcopy documents that it describes.

Cross-book linking works for z/OS documents in both BookManager and PDF format. For PDFs, the links are indicated by blue highlighting around a document reference, and the linking documents must be in the same directory. For BookManager, cross-book linking is supported by BookManager READ/MVS on z/OS. The linked documents must be uploaded to z/OS and must be located on the same bookshelf.

Cross-book linking also works among z/OS PDFs and BookManager documents (served by BookServer) on the z/OS Internet library. Cross-book linking for documents on CD-ROMs or DVD also works among documents on the same disc or DVD.

PDFs link to each other by file name, and IBM changes a document's file name whenever the document is updated. Thus a link from an unchanged PDF may not connect to a new edition of a target document, because the new edition has a new file name. However, a link from an unchanged PDF will still connect to its original target document. Therefore, if you maintain your own PDF repository, IBM recommends that you keep multiple levels of PDFs together in the same directory, to minimize unresolved links. By contrast, BookManager documents link to each other by their base order numbers, which stay the same from release to release, so an unchanged BOOK file can usually link successfully to an updated target BOOK file.

Viewing and printing z/OS softcopy documents

There are a number of ways that you can view and print z/OS information, depending on your needs and what facilities are available to you. IBM provides the *z/OS Collection* and the *z/OS Software Products DVD Collection*, which contain BookManager and PDF formats of the z/OS documents. Both softcopy formats (as well as additional documents and information) are also available from the z/OS Internet library at:

A BookManager softcopy document is the same entity, regardless of the BookManager product or the operating system that you are using. The z/OS product includes both BookManager READ and BookManager BookServer as base elements.

The method that you use to access and print documents or sections of documents will depend on whether your company has established its own softcopy repository of IBM information, or whether you are accessing the information on the Internet or from CD-ROM.

Viewing softcopy information

Here are some common methods that you can use to view z/OS softcopy information.

- If your company has established a softcopy repository on z/OS:
 - BookManager READ/MVS allows users on the z/OS system to access and read documents.
 - BookManager BookServer allows users to access and read documents over an Internet or intranet connection using an HTML browser.
- If you are accessing the information from IBM's z/OS Internet library:
 - Almost all of the z/OS documents are provided as BookManager documents, and they can be accessed and searched from your browser using the functions provided by BookManager BookServer.
 - The z/OS documents are also provided in PDF format. Although the primary purpose for providing these files is for printing, they can also be viewed online.
 - Some documents are provided as HTML files, and they can be accessed and searched using your browser functions.
- If you are accessing the information from CD-ROM (such as the *z/OS Collection*):
 - The BookManager softcopy can be viewed online using any supported IBM BookManager reader, such as the IBM Softcopy Reader, which can be installed from the tools disc of the *z/OS Collection*. IBM readers allow you to read any BookManager document.
 - The PDF files can be viewed online using the Acrobat Reader. If you need information on installing and using an Acrobat Reader, see the Adobe Web site at <http://www.adobe.com>.
- The documents can also be accessed in repositories on other operating systems by using the BookManager READ products or Acrobat Readers for those systems.

Printing softcopy information

You can print hardcopy when you need it from the softcopy files provided for the z/OS documentation, whether you are accessing those files from a CD-ROM, the z/OS Internet library, or a local repository or Web site.

- If you are viewing a softcopy file and you want hardcopy of a topic or two, you can print from the BOOK or PDF file you are viewing.
- For a complete hardcopy document that looks like a traditional manual you would order from IBM, print the PDF file for the document.

Printing from a BOOK file: How to print topics from a BOOK file depends on how you are viewing that file:

- From your workstation, with IBM Softcopy Reader (for example, to read a BOOK file from a CD-ROM).
- From the z/OS Internet library, which uses IBM BookManager BookServer to display BookManager files.
- From a z/OS host, with BookManager READ.

Ordering Information

Because the printout is from the BOOK file itself, the output looks like the BOOK file, with numbered sections and subsections instead of page numbers. You should only use the BOOK file to print a topic or two, and not the whole document.

Using IBM Softcopy Reader: To print the topic you are currently viewing:

- Click the Print icon or go to File --> Print to open a Print window.
- Click the Current button. This opens your workstation Print window.
- Complete the print options in your workstation Print window, then click OK to print the current topic.

To print selected topics:

- Select the desired topics in the "table of contents" frame.
- Hold down the Shift key to select a list of topics, or hold down the Ctrl key to select specific topics.
- Click the Print icon or go to File --> Print to open a Print window.
- Click the Selected button. This opens your workstation Print window.
- Complete the print options in your workstation Print window, then click OK to print the selected topics.

Using the z/OS Internet library: Printing from the z/OS Internet library gives you a very high-quality output. To print the topic you are currently viewing:

- Click your browser Print icon. Follow the usual steps for printing from your browser.

To print select topics:

- Click the BookManager BookServer Print icon (not your browser Print icon) to a Print Preview window.
- Highlight the desired topics from the selection box. Hold down the Shift key to select a list of topics or hold down the Ctrl key to select specific topics.
- Click the Selected topics button. You then see a formatted preview of the topics.
- Use your browser's print facility to produce a hardcopy document of the information shown.

To print a whole document: the BookServer on the z/OS Internet library displays an icon for the corresponding PDF file, if available, next to each BOOK file on a bookshelf. If you find a document you want to print in its entirety under BookServer, you can click the corresponding PDF file and print it as described in "Printing a PDF file" on page 10.

Using BookManager READ: If your company has established a softcopy repository on z/OS, you can use the Print option of BookManager READ to get hardcopy of a topic or two. However, BookManager READ by itself (without other programs such as DCF and BookMaster®, which are not part of z/OS) provides a lower quality print than printing from BookManager BookServer. It is essentially a screen print.

Sometimes, though, BookManager READ may be the only available option. In that case, here's how to proceed.

- Open the document.
- Set your print options by selecting the Options pull-down menu.
- Select option 5 (Set print options) and specify the desired options.

Ordering Information

- Use the PRINT command to print one or more topics in the document. (BookManager READ/MVS invokes the ISPF panels you normally use to print at your site.)
- Enter the command in one of the following ways:
 - PRINT PRINT topic1
 - PRINT topic1 TO topic2
 - PRINT topic1 FOR number-of-topics.

To print the current topic, enter the PRINT command without operands. To print all of a topic (such as 1.0), including its subtopics: enter the next topic number (such as 2.0), then prev. Make note of the last topic number (for example, 1.6.4), then enter the PRINT command with the complete range (PRINT 1.0 TO 1.6.4).

Printing a PDF file

In the workstation environment, you use an Adobe Acrobat Reader to view and print PDF files. For large or graphically complex documents that need to be printed on an AFP™ printer, you might want to have the host handle the transforms, instead of doing it on the workstation before sending the file.

To print PDFs from a host repository you can use z/OS and the optional Infoprint® Server feature to expand your options for printing PDF files.

Using an Adobe Acrobat Reader: Install an Adobe Acrobat Reader on your computer. The *z/OS Collection* contains a recent level of an Adobe Acrobat Reader (at no extra charge), which you can install using the tools disc. You can also go to the Adobe Web site at www.adobe.com for other readers or more information.

- Open the PDF you want to print. The PDF can be on a CD-ROM, on the z/OS Internet library, or any where you can view it with an Adobe Acrobat Reader
- Select the Reader's Print option
- Select the desired printer and specify other print options as appropriate.
- Click OK.

If you decide to print a subset of a document from a PDF file, the pages (as understood by Adobe Acrobat Reader) are totally sequential. The Reader views the front cover as page 1. There are no Roman numeral page numbers for the front matter, no section numbering. When you specify the pages to print, enter the page numbers from the Reader's point of view. Check the page box at the bottom of the screen and not as they appear on the individual pages of the document.

Using a LAN- or host-attached AFP printer: It's not feasible to print large or graphically complex PDF files on the typical desktop or LAN-attached printer. z/OS Infoprint Server with the Infoprint Server Transforms allows you to print high-quality hardcopy of PDF files on high-speed LAN-attached or host-attached AFP printers managed by PSF for OS/390.

Workstation users on a LAN connected to z/OS can print PDFs from a CD-ROM, the Web, or the LAN. Host users can print PDFs from an MVS or HFS data set, such as a host repository of softcopy files, or PDFs uploaded from a CD-ROM. For details, see the z/OS Infoprint Server documentation on the *z/OS Collection* or on the z/OS Internet library at:

Using OHELP to access softcopy documents for online help

Using the OHELP facility of z/OS UNIX System Services, your installation can make z/OS BookManager softcopy documents available to TSO/E users for topic-level online help information. The users must be defined to z/OS UNIX System Services, and you must define the documents in the OHELP bookshelf to the OHELP facility. Once defined, users can invoke OHELP to search a specified document or the entire OHELP bookshelf for a string, such as a command name or message identifier or some text. OHELP lists the matches within the document or the bookshelf for that string. You can then select a matched topic and view it in the softcopy document.

See *z/OS UNIX System Services Planning* for information on installing and customizing OHELP and *z/OS UNIX System Services Command Reference* for information on using OHELP.

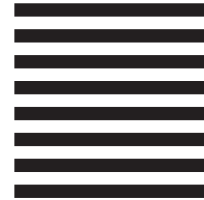
